






For Sale in Fairburn - Map












Potential Retail Sites







Traffic Count Map



FAIRBURN FACTS

- Fairburn was incorporated on February 17, 1854.
- Fairburn's City Charter was adopted on August 3, 1925.
- Fairburn's Downtown Business District is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
- Fairburn occupies 17.1 square miles.
- Fairburn's population is 14,645 plus and growing.
- Fairburn is home to a seasonal Farmer's Market, June 1 through August 31.
- Fairburn is home to the Georgia Renaissance Festival.
- Fairburn has an annual Christmas Tree Lighting at the historic train depot downtown.
- Fairburn hosts an Annual Arts and Music Festival.
- Fairburn is rapidly emerging as a residential, commercial and light industrial hub. Fairburn has easy access to Interstate 85, Hartsfield Jackson International Airport and downtown Atlanta.

FAIRBURN PARKS

- *Duncan Park* is located in Fairburn on Rivertown Road west of downtown. The park is open for use year round from dusk to dawn. A tennis court, basketball courts and pavilions are available. The pavilion may be rented for a nominal fee.
- Cora M. Robinson Park, a neighborhood park located on Dodd Street, contains a playground and gazebo for area residents.
- Cochran Mill Nature Center is a private, non-profit, environmental education and wildlife rehabilitation facility. Located just about 8 miles from Fairburn on 50 heavily wooded acres, the facility consists of a 4,000 sq. ft. log lodge, miles of hiking trails, wetlands, waterfalls and granite rock outcroppings. Cochran Mill is a Fulton County Park.
